

Luso-American Education Foundation Scholarships and Grants for Current College Students

The Luso-American Education Foundation (LAEF) is dedicated to helping current college students to succeed by awarding scholarships and grants for continued education.

The Luso-American Education Foundation offers numerous Scholarships and Grants which have various Criteria and Eligibilities, but all applicants must:

- 1. Be a legal resident of the United States
- 2. Be of Portuguese/Lusophone descent or provide proof of study in the Portuguese language/culture
- 3. Meet ONE of the following requirements:
 - Attending a community or four-year college/university
 - Enrolled in a Post Graduate Program (i.e. Masters, PhD, Credential Program)
 - Be an educator of Portuguese language and/or culture
 - Preparing for a professional career where regular use of the Portuguese language is expected

(D-1) Herbert Fernandes Memorial Scholarship – a non-renewable scholarship. Amount of scholarship will vary. Applicants must also meet the following requirements:

- 1. Minimum college GPA of 3.5, or 3.0 if taking or has taken Portuguese Language courses
- 2. Applicants must also meet at least one of the following requirements:
 - Actively involved in a Portuguese American Community
 - Has taken Portuguese language classes at the college level

(D-2) Graduate Scholarship – a non-renewable scholarship; however, applicant may apply up to 4 academic years. Scholarship amount - \$2,500

Applicants must also meet ONE of the following requirements:

- Be of Portuguese descent with a minimum college GPA of 3.5
- Pursuing a Graduate Degree/Credential Program in Portuguese language or culture with a minimum college GPA of 3.0

(D-3) Amadeu dos Santos & Helen Rose Picado Memorial Scholarship – a non-renewable scholarship.

However, applicant may apply each academic year. Scholarship amount may vary; minimum - \$1,500

Applicant must not be a direct descendant of the donor

Applicants must also meet ALL of the following requirements:

- 1. Enrolled in a Graduate/Credential Program (i.e. Masters, PhD, Credential program)
- 2. Minimum college GPA of 3.0
- 3. Be of Portuguese or Lusophone ancestry

Applicants must also meet ONE of the following:

- Speak Portuguese with at least minimal fluency
- Currently taking Portuguese language classes
- Portuguese is spoken at home
- Strong identification with Portuguese or Lusophone heritage

(G-1) Research Project Grant - a non-renewable grant; however, applicant may apply up to 3 academic years. Grant amount – Up to \$2,000

Applicants must also meet the following requirements:

1. Conducting Research that is relevant to Luso American Education Foundation's goal of promoting Portuguese language and/or Lusophone cultures

(G-2) Portuguese Summer Language Program Grant at a University in the United States - a non-renewable grant; however, applicant may apply up to 3 academic years. Grant amount – Up to \$2,000

Applicants must also meet ONE of the following requirements:

- Be enrolled in an accredited college or university
- Be preparing for a professional career where knowledge of the Portuguese language is useful
- Working towards a bachelor's or higher degree in Portuguese studies

(G-3) Summer Program in Portugal - a non-renewable grant; however, applicant may apply up to 3 academic years. Grant amount – Up to \$3,000

Applicants must also meet ONE of the following requirements:

- Be enrolled in an accredited college or university
- Be preparing for a professional career where knowledge of the Portuguese language is useful
- Working towards a bachelor's or higher degree in Portuguese studies

(G-4) Semester Program for Study in Portugal Network (SiPN) - a non-renewable grant; however, applicant may apply up to 3 academic years. Grant amount – Up to \$3,000

Applicants must also meet ONE of the following requirements:

- Be enrolled in an accredited college or university
- Be preparing for a professional career where knowledge of the Portuguese language is useful
- Working towards a bachelor's or higher degree in Portuguese studies

(G-5) Program for Educator Grant - a non-renewable grant; however, applicant may apply up to 3 academic years. Grant amount will vary.

Applicants must also meet the following requirement:

1. Be an educator of the Portuguese language and/or Lusophone cultures

(G-6) Life-Long Learning - a non-renewable grant; however, applicant may apply up to 3 academic years. Grant amount will vary.

Note: Applicants preparing for a professional career where Portuguese language will be used, will receive priority

(G-7) Nicole Marie Goulart Memorial Grant - a non-renewable grant; however, applicant may apply each year. Grant amount will vary. Applicant must not be a direct descendant of the donor.

Applicants must also meet ONE of the following requirements:

- Working towards a bachelor's or higher degree in Portuguese studies
- Preparing for a professional career where the use of the Portuguese Language is needed

The Grant application and the following items must be postmarked or received in our office by MARCH 1st for the application to qualify and be reviewed by the scholarship committee. Your application will not be considered if it does not include the following:

- Completed application form
- Official transcript of all college coursework which must be issued and certified by school officials (if applicable)
- The score from GRE or any other equivalent standardized test (if applicable)
- Sealed letters of Recommendation from two individuals who can speak of your character and/or financial need
- Recent wallet size photo of yourself which includes your full name via e-mail to education@ luso- american.org
